What is Unique About the Management College?

The Capstone Project

As a central element of the Management College experience, participants work in teams on a consulting project in a North Texas law enforcement organization. Participants interview agency personnel, conduct research, undertake a literature review, and formulate recommendations before presenting their findings in a written report and an oral presentation.

Off-Site Team Building

Successful leaders are skilled at building strong and effective teams. In concert with a professional leadership development group, participants will take part in a one-day off-site team-building experience designed to develop a range of leadership abilities including goal setting, delegation, time management, effective communication, and teamwork.

Professional Networking Opportunities

Participants in the Management College are eligible to join the ILEA Alumni Association, a nationwide organization of past graduates with an interest in continuous improvement in the profession of law enforcement management. Members of the Alumni Association are able to continue the Management College learning experience through networking with colleagues, and low-cost participation in the annual Contemporary Issues Conference.
