WHY BECOME A MEMBER?

Members are entitled to serve or to appoint one or more persons to serve on the Institute's Advisory Board, depending on the membership level. Advisory Board members are entitled to tuition-free attendance at the **Annual Oil & Gas Law Conference** and discounted attendance at all other Institute programs. Advisory Board members also receive the Institute's quarterly e-newsletter, *The Energy Law Advisor*, discounts on all other Institute publications, and access to the Institute's members-only website and online forums. THE ADVISORY BOARD

The work of the IEL is done primarily through its Advisory Board, and its committees. The current practice committees of the IEL are: Oil and Gas, International, Oilfield Services, Power & Alternative Energy, Litigation & Dispute Resolution and Young Energy Professionals.

The Advisory Board and its committees meet for business and social activities each February in connection with the Annual Oil & Gas Law Conference. Other committee activities occur throughout the year.

Other special events include the John Rogers Award Dinner and the Deans of Oil and Gas Lecture Luncheon, presented during the Annual Oil & Gas Law Conference, and the Special Achievement in Energy Litigation Award Luncheon during the Annual Energy Litigation Conference.

PROGRAMS AND PUBLICATIONS

Each year the Institute for Energy Law offers its two-day **Annual Oil & Gas Law Conference**, which was first presented in 1949 and is now the oldest continuing legal education program in the country. Other programs customarily presented annually include an **Energy Litigation Conference**; **International Energy Law, Contracts and Negotiations – Upstream**; **International Energy Law, Contracts and Negotiations – Midstream**; **Short Course on Oil and Gas Law**; **YEP General Counsel Forum**; **Law of Shale Plays Conference**; an **Oilfield Services Law Conference**, a **Midstream Oil and Gas Law Conference** and an **International Offshore Oil & Gas Law Conference**. Every other year the Institute presents an advanced **International Oil & Gas Law Conference** and the **IEL- ANADE Conference (Mexico City)**, and supports an **Institute for Natural Resources Law Teachers**. **Webcasts** and **webinars** on hot topics in the industry are presented periodically.
