COURSES AND CONFERENCES

ETHICS TRAIN-THE-TRAINER COURSE

Successful completion of this program authorizes graduates to present ILEA's 8 hour Law Enforcement Ethics and 16 hour Ethics for Field Training Officer courses within their own organizations and academies.

ETHICS AND ETHICAL DECISION MAKING

A one-day seminar that offers strategies to help improve ethical decision making on both a personal and professional level.

SERVANT LEADERSHIP

This program is presented as an informal group discussion based on the concepts developed by the Robert K. Greenleaf Center for Applied Ethics. It emphasizes service to others, a holistic approach to work, promoting a sense of community and the sharing of power and decision-making.

CREATING A CULTURE OF INTEGRITY

This seminar focuses on defining what a culture of integrity is, and once defined, how we align the traits of individual integrity with the values, policy and practices of the organization. Participants examine policing over time and develop strategies for improving public trust and enhancing police legitimacy using a Best Practices model.

ADVANCED ETHICS TRAIN-THE-TRAINER COURSE

This program explores various aspects of theoretical ethics in western, eastern and other societies. It is designed for those more seasoned ethics facilitators who wish to increase their knowledge.

TEACHING DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION: STRATEGIES FOR INSTRUCTORS

Successful completion of this 40 hour program will prepare officers to conduct diversity training within their organizations and academies. With a focus on cross-cultural communication, understanding implicit bias and various "bridge" building strategies, graduates are able to navigate the difficulties and misunderstanding brought about by difference.

DIVERSITY THROUGH ETHICAL LEADERSHIP

This program examines communication, upbringing, gender, age and other variables to help participants find the link between ethical behavior and the fair and balanced treatment of all our citizens.

CONTEMPORARY ISSUES AND ETHICS CONFERENCE

For more than 25 years, this annual assembly has challenged police managers and executives to explore emerging topics and issues that confront the law enforcement profession.

The Contemporary Issues Conference is designed for senior-level police personnel, interested attorneys, and city managers from across the nation to engage in extensive, practical discussions and debates concerning the most pressing ethical issues facing civic leaders today.
