Dr. T. Neil Moore currently serves as the Director of Curriculum and Instruction for FBI-LEEDA. He is a veteran police trainer. As the former Director of the Institute for Law Enforcement Administration (ILEA) in Plano, Texas, he directed the delivery of leadership and ethics programs for police supervisors and executives throughout the nation. As part of ILEA, he and the ILEA staff also worked closely with the Lebanese Internal Security Force for four years to train their entire command staff.

Prior to his tenure with ILEA, Neil served as the Executive Director of the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute and, as Director of the Center for Criminal Sciences at the Indiana Institute of Technology. His work also included a seven and one-half year stint as an assistant professor of criminal justice at the Fort Wayne campus of Indiana University.

Neil began his police career with the Fort Wayne Police Department in 1977. He was promoted to chief in 1988 and served as the departments lead executive for ten years. Neil directed the implementation of numerous best-practice strategies including a citywide, agency-wide model of community policing. The Fort Wayne Police Department grew from 300 to 400 sworn members during his tenure as chief.

Neil holds a Bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Kent State University, a Master of Public Affairs degree from Indiana University, and a Doctorate in Adult and Community Education from Ball State University. His dissertation was titled "Citizen Perspectives on Community Policing: An Examination of the Theories, Principles and Practices at Work". He continues to study and learn about leadership, community policing and ethics to this day.
