GROUND ZERO 360: NEVER FORGET

is a critically acclaimed exhibit premiering in North Central Texas.

It honors the victims of the 2001 terrorist attacks and commemorates the heroism of police officers, firefighters and other first responders who put themselves at risk to save others. They were true Upstanders.

This exhibit showcases photographs of New York-based Irish photographer Nicola McClean, who captured the confusion, panic and remarkable heroism at Ground Zero and the surrounding neighborhoods in the hours and days that followed.

Artifacts include the helmets of fallen rescue workers and fragments of granite and steel I-beams from the World Trade Center.

Ground Zero 360 reminds visitors of both the fragility and strength of democracy and the vital need for moral action, even in times of incredible duress. Up to 15,000 people were saved by first responders on that fateful day.
